

Alton Towers Resort unveils vibrant art sculpture created by children as thousands flock to the first weekend of Mardi Gras

Tuesday 24th May - Hundreds of students are behind a special art sculpture unveiled by Alton Towers Resort as part of its Mardi Gras celebration, and is now set to be seen by thousands over the coming weeks as it takes pride of place at the event.

Pupils from across Staffordshire schools have come together to create the colourful and poignant art piece as part of Mardi Gras taking place from May 21st to June 19th, which sees the Resort totally transformed into a carnival-style event thanks to an explosion of colours, sounds and high-energy entertainment – of which the sculpture will take centre stage for the entire run.



Umbrellas, which are the accessory of choice at Mardi Gras parades due to the seasonal rainy weather in the southern American states, were donated to schools in the local community for them to design and decorate based around several themes including 'celebration', 'carnival' and 'what community means to you'.

From the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, wellbeing and mindfulness, to bright and vibrant flowers and traditional Mardi Gras theming, the umbrella globe is now displayed as a focal point as part of the Mardi Gras celebration.

Ten schools were involved in the project and have been invited to the Theme Park to see their creations, including Forsbrook C of E Primary School, Ryecroft CE Middle School (Rocester), Painsley

Catholic College (Cheadle), Denstone College, All Saints CE Academy (Denstone), JCB Academy (Rocester), Blythe Bridge High School, Abbey Hill School and Performing Arts College (Meir), St Peters C of E First School (Alton) and Queen Elizabeth Grammar School (Ashbourne).





The pupils will now all be invited to see their artwork over the half-term holiday and bank holiday weekend when Mardi Gras is expected to attract thousands set to join the party atmosphere.

Mrs Johnson, who lead the project for Blythe Bridge High School, said: "I really enjoy working with Alton Towers Resort on their community art project. The project really develops our students creative thinking and allows them to be very expressive. I think it's important that students work on community projects so that they see their artwork viewed by the wider the community outside of their school setting."

The new piece has been installed in front of the iconic Alton Towers backdrop, alongside last year's pilot community project of guitars.



Ms Alston from Ryecroft Middle School in Rocester has joined the project for a second year and finds it beneficial to students in many ways, she said: "The immediate impact of this project has been how enthusiastic and excited pupils were to take part. It has given us an opportunity to work on a 3D project and year 6 pupils have enjoyed taking part during SATS week as a mindful stress reliving activity."
