## School reopening

# Mobile Phone Policy change

Over the last few weeks we have taken the opportunity to review our school rules surrounding mobile phones. As part of this process we have consulted staff and governors and have made some changes to our rules around mobile phones in our school building. From September 2022 the main guidelines are as follows:

- \*At all times during the school day, mobile phones are not allowed to be used by pupils for any purpose.
- \*If pupils choose to bring a mobile phone with them to school they must be **turned off** and stored in their locker. We will no longer store pupils mobile phones in the school office.

Whilst we appreciate this is a significant change, we feel the change is necessary for the following reason:

\*Mobile phones can cause a significant disruption to the smooth running of the school, including the main office where pupils can be waiting a significant amount of time to hand in or collect their device. This can amount to a loss of learning time.

All pupils will be reminded of these rules on the first day back in September. Should a pupil be found breaching the rules, the phone will be confiscated.

## Uniform

We are very grateful for your support with our high expectations for school uniform. Please see a reminder of our expectations for uniform below:

### Girls

- Ryecroft branded jumper
- Plain white blouse with collar
- Plain black/blue tailored skirt (knee length, not jersey/lycra) or plain black tailored trousers (not jeans)
- School tie
- Black tights or black socks
- Plain black shoes with a low heel (no trainers, sling backs, mules or pumps)

#### Boys

- Ryecroft branded jumper
- Plain white shirt with collar
- Plain black tailored trousers (no jeans) or black shorts (summer term only)
- School tie
- Black socks
- Plain black shoes (no trainers)
- No extreme hair styles or excessive hair accessories are permitted.
- Hair should be kept neat and tidy and worn in a style that does not compromise health or safety.
- Hair should not be dyed unnatural hair colours, be shaved off or have colours or patterns/ words cut or woven into. Should a pupil come to school with an extreme hairstyle, a member of the leadership team will work with the parents and pupil to come to a decision about a reasonable timescale for alteration, normally less than one week. For example, if a child has patterns shaved into their hair, they should seek to even out the hairstyle each day until the pattern has gone.
- Pupils should not attend school wearing makeup or coloured nail varnish. This also includes no nail extensions, acrylic, gel, long and/or pointed nails. If they do so they will asked to remove it.

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## Equipment

It is essential that all pupils come to school fully equipped and prepared for learning. This means that each pupil, every day, needs to bring the following equipment:

- School Bag we ask that these are not excessively large and are 'locker size' appropriate
- A minimum of 2 blue handwriting pens (Berol)
- Pencil
- Highlighter
- Ruler
- Pencil Case
- Glue Stick
- Rubber
- Reading Book
- <u>KS3 Pupils only</u> Scientific Calculator (recommended model Casio FX-83GT) compass and protractor

Please note, for health and safety reasons, metal water bottles will not be allowed from September.

In September we will be introducing a new online system to set homework. This will replace our current paper planners. More details to follow.

#### Lockers

All pupils will be allocated a locker from September. These are deemed a privilege and school holds the rights to withdraw this privilege should it be abused in any way or to the detriment of any pupil. In order to keep all pupils safe we ask that you adhere to the safe usage and regulations below:

- Pupils will take responsibility and ownership of their locker.
- School lockers will be inspected on a regular basis. Lockers need to be kept clean and free from belongings which are prohibited on the school premises.
- Lockers need to be emptied and cleared out at the end of every half term.
- Damage caused to any locker may be chargeable.
- Students are not to swap or change lockers as all lockers are allocated on an individual basis, and a record is kept with details of ownership in the School office.

If you choose to purchase a lock for your child's locker may we suggest the use of a combination padlock to minimise the loss of keys. Please purchase a padlock with a narrow shackle so that it fits the locker.

As shared in previous correspondence, we say thank you and goodbye to some staff today. We wish Miss Wanford and Mr Howlett all the very best as they move on to new teaching appointments. We thank them for all their hard work and commitment - their new schools are very lucky to have them. Miss Boot leaves us today to commence her maternity leave, and we wish her well and we look forward to hearing news of a safe arrival very soon. We also celebrate two weddings this summer as Miss Starkey and Ms Tarlton, each get married – congratulations to them!
