### Year 6 Trip to York – Monday 6th to Wednesday 8th October 2025

The Year 6 visit to York is approaching fast! Thank you for your support in enabling your child to attend. This letter outlines key details you and your child will need before the visit.

#### Departure & Arrival

- Pupils should arrive at school at **8:00am** on Monday 6th October to allow time for luggage loading and a brief toilet break.
- The coach will depart promptly at **8:30am**.
- Upon arrival, children will place their belongings in the hall and be guided by staff before boarding the coach.

#### Itinerary

##### Monday 6th October

- Children must bring a packed lunch
- Afternoon: Whitby Abbey and Robin Hood's Bay
- Evening: Check-in at **York YHA** (single-sex dormitories with bunk beds)

##### Tuesday 7th October

- Morning: Jorvik Dig
- Afternoon: Chocolate Story
- Evening: Ghost Walk (child friendly)

##### Wednesday 8th October

- Morning: Boat trip on the River Ouse
- Afternoon: Depart York, arriving back at school at approximately **5:30pm** (depending on traffic)

#### Dietary & Medication

- Any changes to dietary or medical needs should be communicated to reception as soon as possible.

### Spending Money

- Children may bring spending money in a **sealed, named envelope**. Staff will supervise and store money safely.

### Electronics & Supervision

- Mobile phones, tablets, and other electrical devices **are not permitted**. Confiscated items will be returned to parents/carers after the visit.
- All children will carry an **emergency contact card** and remain supervised by staff in small groups at all times.
