Dear Parent/Carer

In Year 6 as part of the RE curriculum pupils learn about different religions and world views. The learning is linked to the Staffordshire Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education. In addition to this, it also supports the children's learning on 'Promoting British Values' through showing *tolerance* and *mutual respect*.

As part of our learning at school, on **Monday 2nd March 2026** we have arranged a visit to the Open Centre in Derby. Whilst the children are at the Open Centre, they will have the opportunity to visit some local places of worship. We will be visiting the Mosque, the Hindu Temple and the Sikh Gurdwara. We believe that it is increasingly important that pupils have an understanding of the diversity of religious traditions, practices and forms of worship found in our country.

Please be assured that under no circumstances will children be asked to participate in any aspect of worship, or be required to compromise their own faith or beliefs during this study visit.

Whilst there, the children will listen to a brief talk centred on their learning and take part in some interactive activities. This will help the children to learn about different faiths and cultures through a personal experience, which we feel, as a school is a necessity in today's modern society.

The cost of this visit is **£15.00**.

Pupils attending this visit will need to have a record of good behaviour and demonstrate that they can obey safety and other rules. Anyone whose behaviour is judged unacceptable may be excluded, or required to return home early and any expenses incurred will be the responsibility of their parents.
